

CHAPTER SEVENTEEN

LICENSING OF SALES AND DELIVERY VEHICLES

17-101. License Required.

It shall be unlawful to use or permit the use of any vehicle, including wagons and motor vehicles and vehicles propelled by human power, for the storage or carrying of any meat, poultry, fish, butter, cheese, lard, vegetables, dairy products, bread or bakery products, or any other provisions intended for human consumption, including beverages, in the City of Highwood for the purpose of delivering any such food stuffs to any place in the City of Highwood for use and consumption at, wholesale or retail, unless said license for such vehicle is first secured and the provisions of this Chapter are fully complied with.

17-102. Application.

Applications for such licenses shall be made to the Chief of Police and shall recite the name and address of the owner of the vehicle, the name or names of the persons for whom such deliveries are made, the license number and vehicle identification number of the vehicle. The City Collector shall upon proper payment issue such license and said license shall be securely attached to the vehicle for which it is issued.

17-103. Annual Fee.

The annual license fee shall be Fifty and No/100's (\$50.00) Dollars if paid on or before May 1st of each calendar year and Sixty Five and No/100's (\$65.00) Dollars if paid thereafter. Such fees shall be paid to the City Collector.

17-104. Regulations.

All such vehicles shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition and shall be thoroughly cleaned each day they are so used. It shall be unlawful to permit stale foods, decaying matter, or any other waste material or product to accumulate in or on any such vehicle while it is so used. If unwrapped food stuffs are transported in any such vehicle, such goods shall be carried in a portion or compartment of the vehicle which is screened and protected against dust and insects.

17-105. Temperature Control.

Readily perishable foods or beverages, while in transit, shall be maintained at a temperature of not less than thirty-five degrees Fahrenheit and not more than fifty degrees Fahrenheit. The temperature for hot liquid foods or beverages shall be maintained at not less than one hundred fifty degrees Fahrenheit; and for frozen foods at not more than thirty-two degrees Fahrenheit. The compartments in vehicles used for carrying such foods shall be so constructed, equipped and maintained as to preserve the temperature as above indicated for the respective types of food.

17-106. Inspections.

It shall be the duty of the Chief of Police or the designated Health Inspector to make or cause to be made such inspections as may be necessary to insure compliance with the provisions of this Chapter.

17-107. Transfer of License.

An additional fee of Ten and No/100's (\$10.00) Dollars shall be paid to the City of Highwood by any person, partnership, corporation or association having a valid delivery license who desires to transfer the said license to another vehicle for the same purpose. Provided, that said valid license may only be transferred to another vehicle for the same purposes, titled to the same party and the old license delivered to the City Clerk.
